Bio of Prof. Bonnie S. McDougall

Bonnie S. McDougall was born and educated in Australia. After three years as a lecturer in Oriental Studies at the University of Sydney, she spent one year at SOAS in London, followed by four years at Harvard. In 1980 she went to China to work at the Foreign Languages Press in Peking, where she stayed for three years, followed by two years at the College of Foreign Affairs. In 1986 she moved to the University of Oslo and in 1990 to the University of Edinburgh. Her publications include translations of modern Chinese poetry, fiction, essays and film, as well as books about modern Chinese literature. She is currently Visiting Professor at the Institute of Chinese Studies and the Department of Chinese Language and Literature at the Chinese University of Hong Kong.
